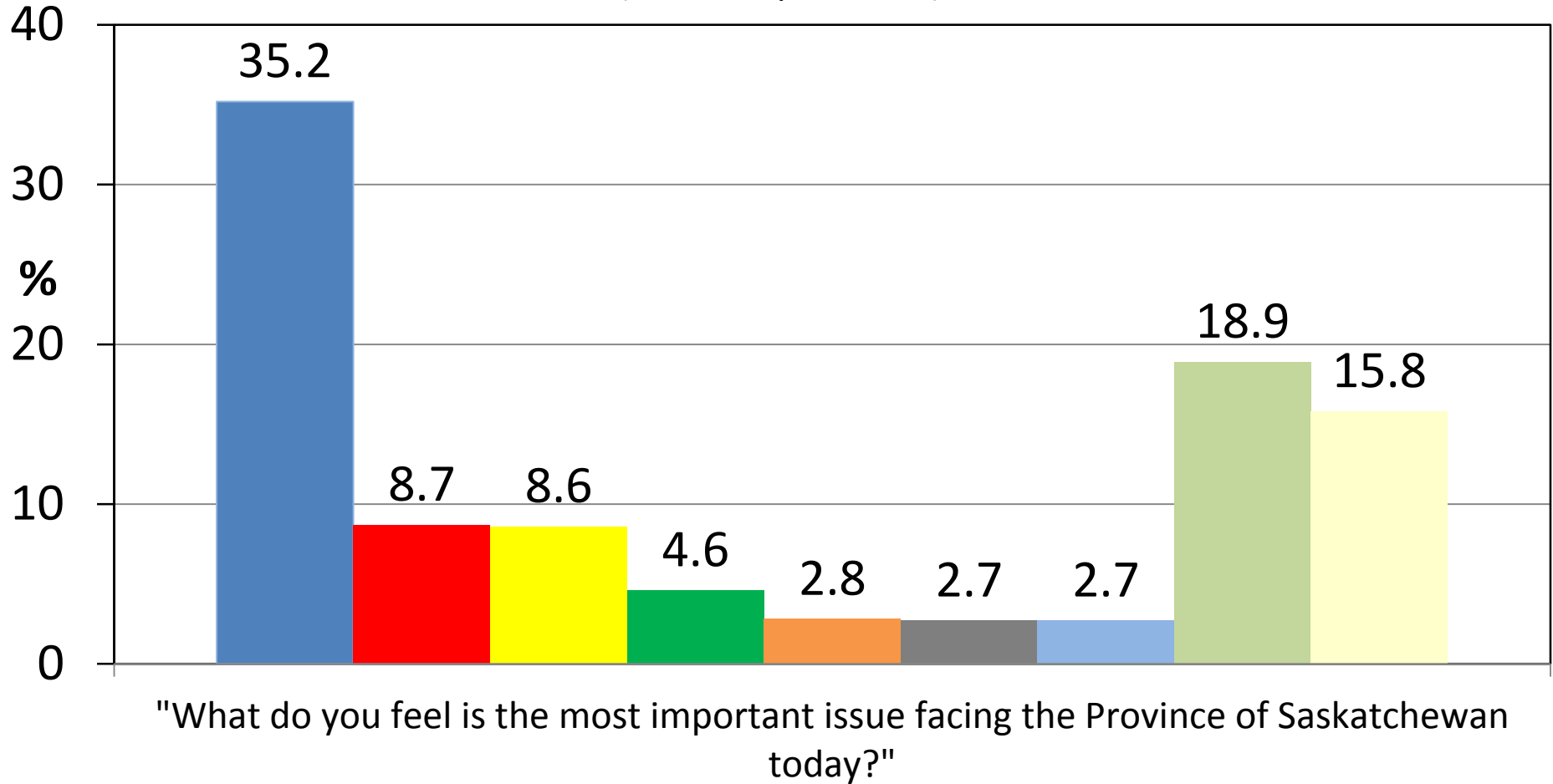
Highlights of Public Opinion Survey

- Telephone survey of 1044 Saskatchewan residents
- Margin of Error of **+/-3%** to 95% Confidence Level
- Survey calls from August 18-September 4, 2014
- Data weighted by Age and Gender

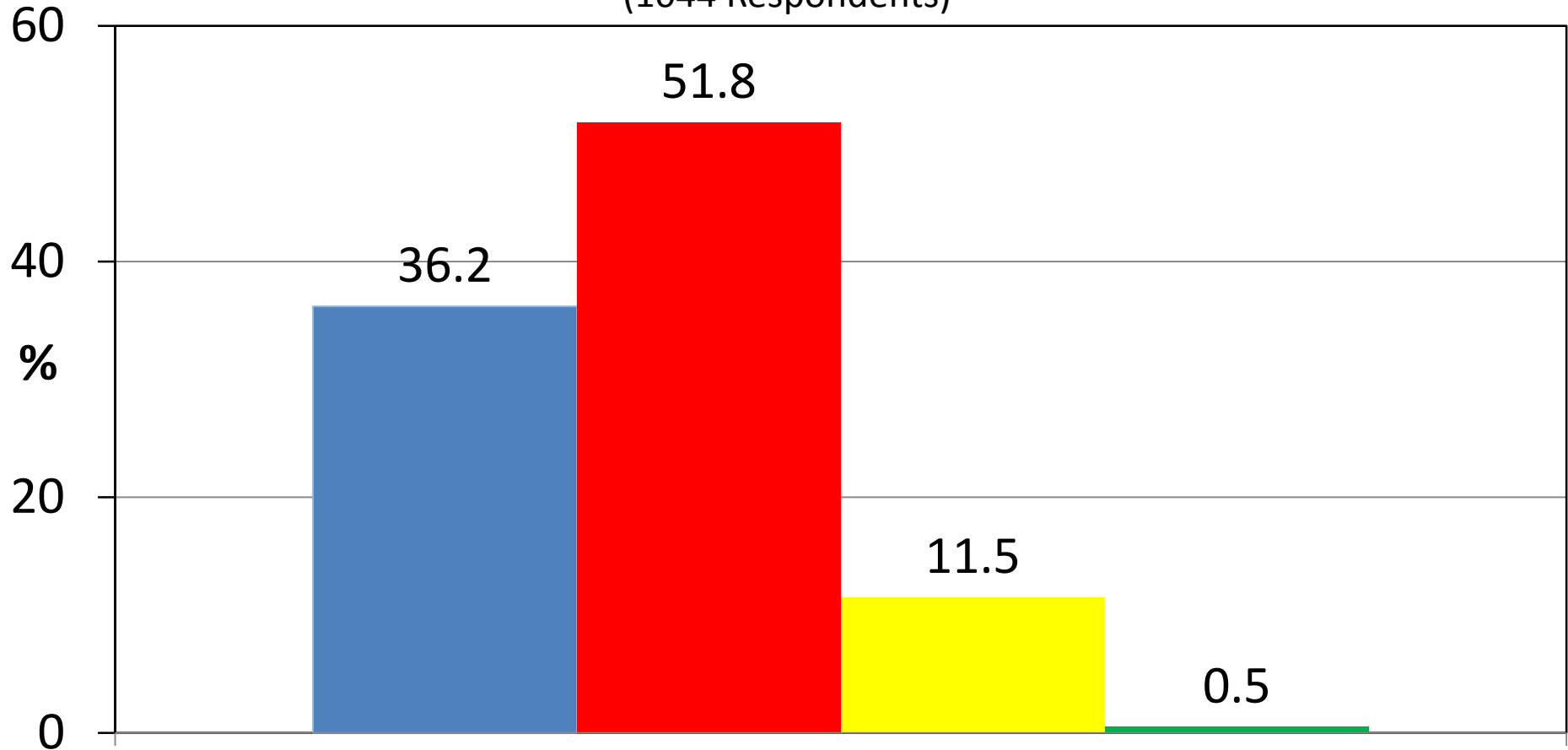

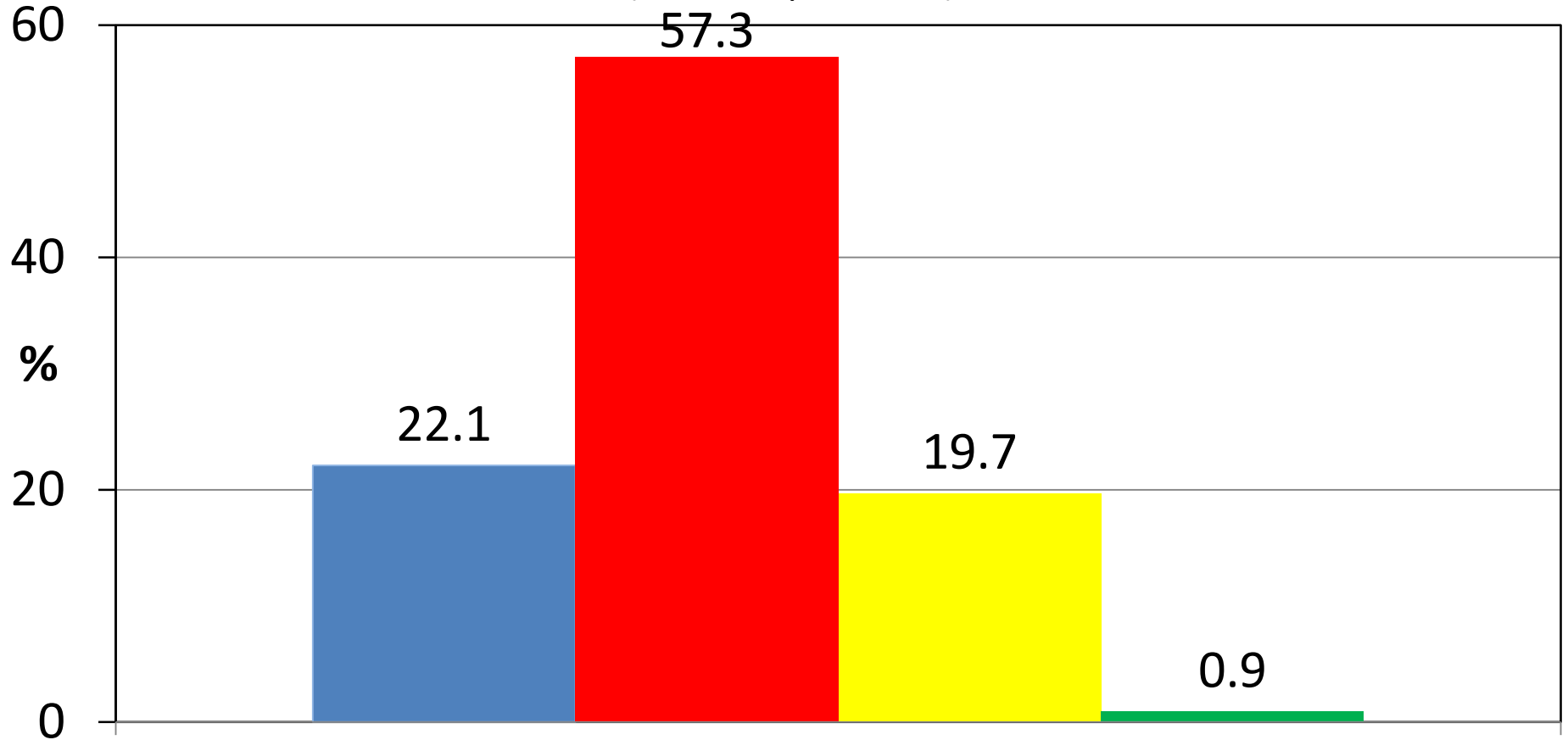

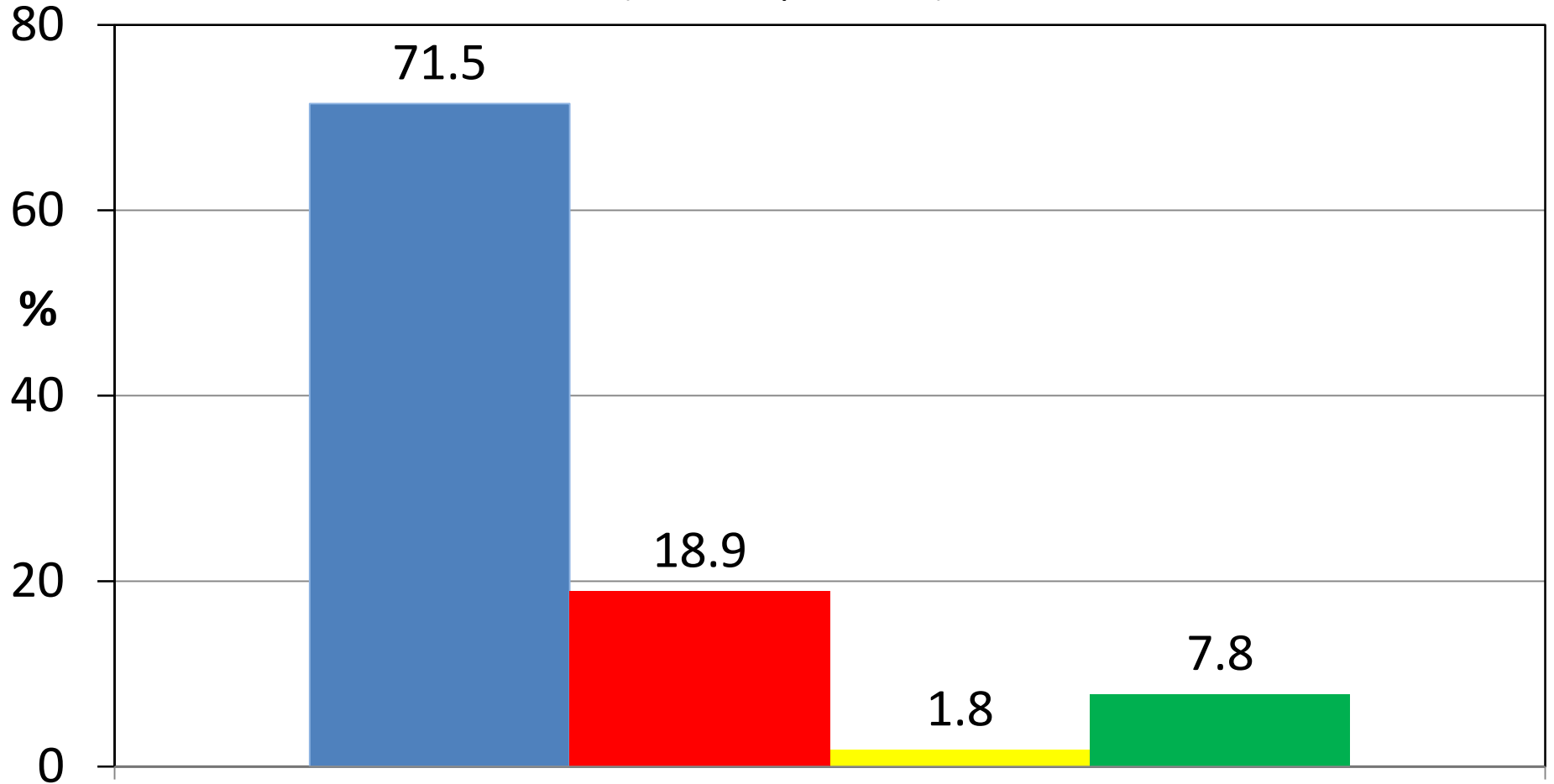

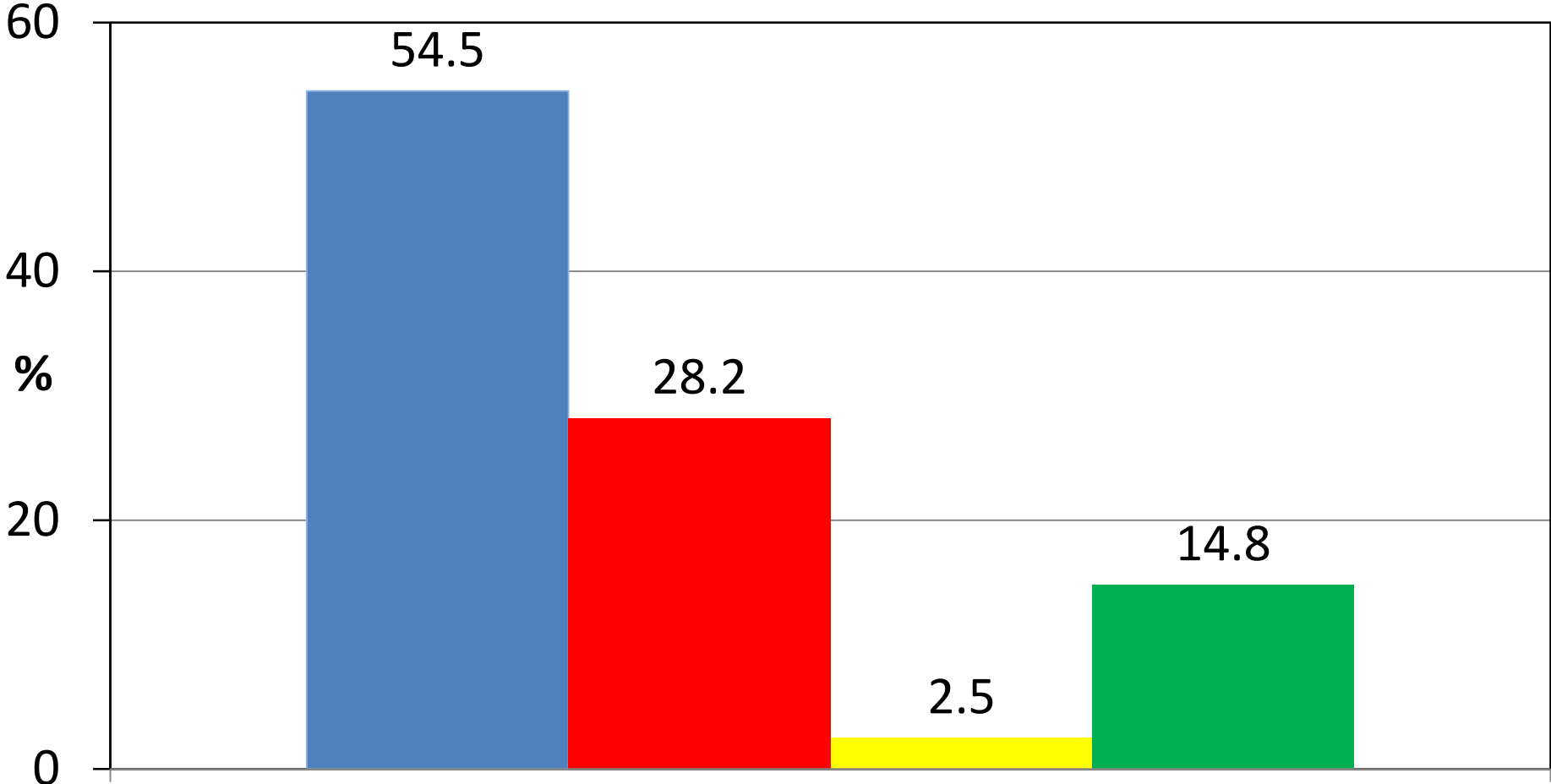

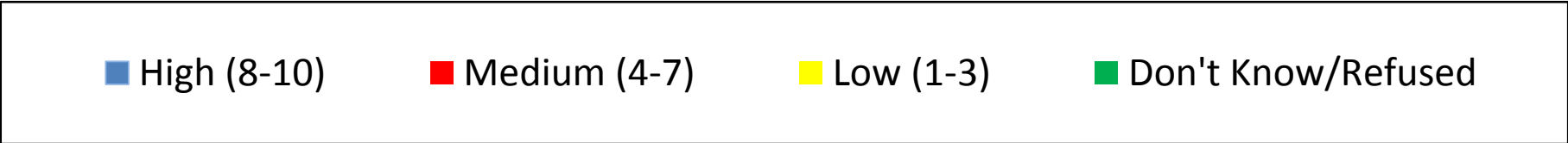

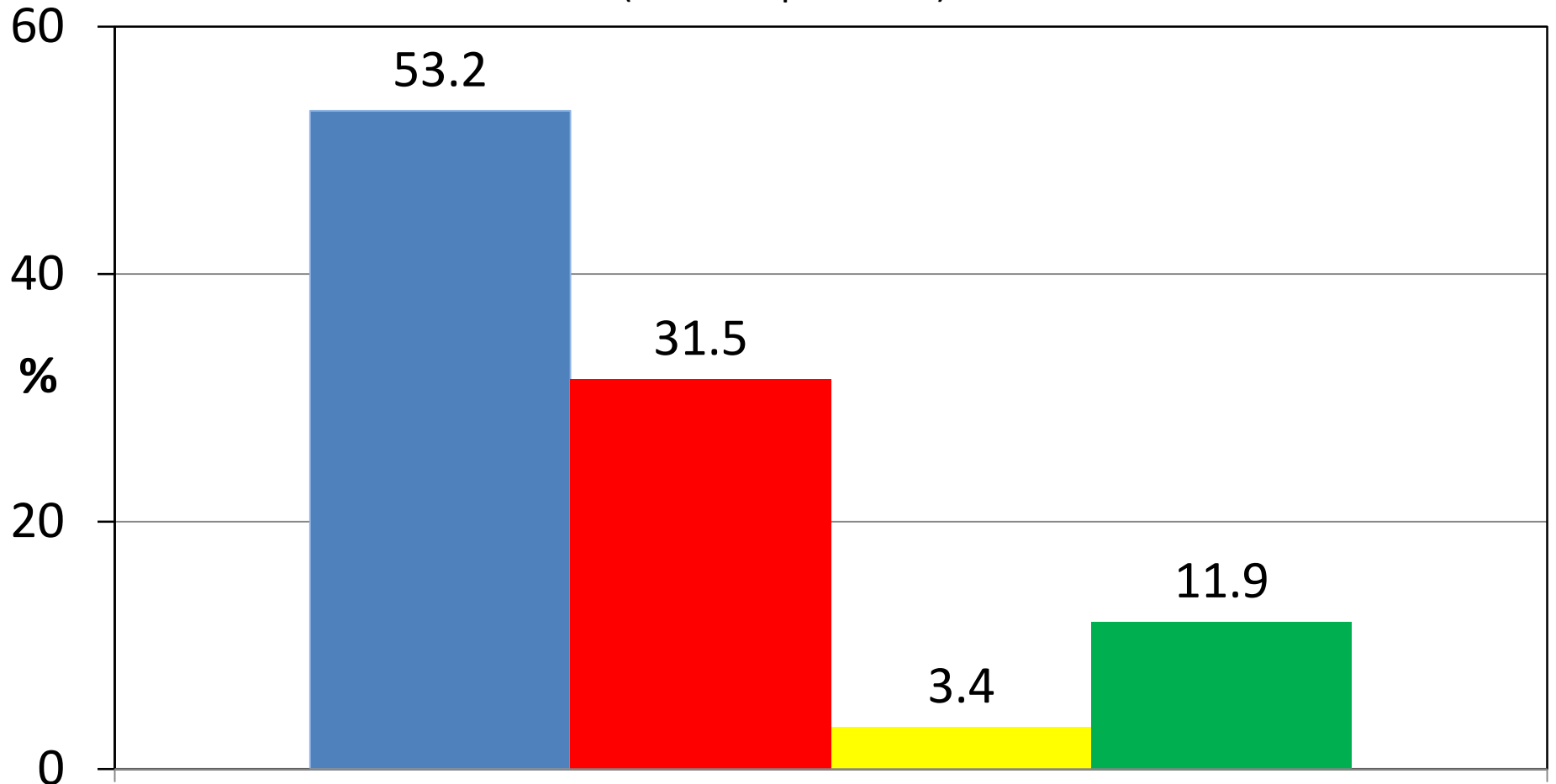


"...How would you rate your confidence level in: Hospital Pharmacists?"

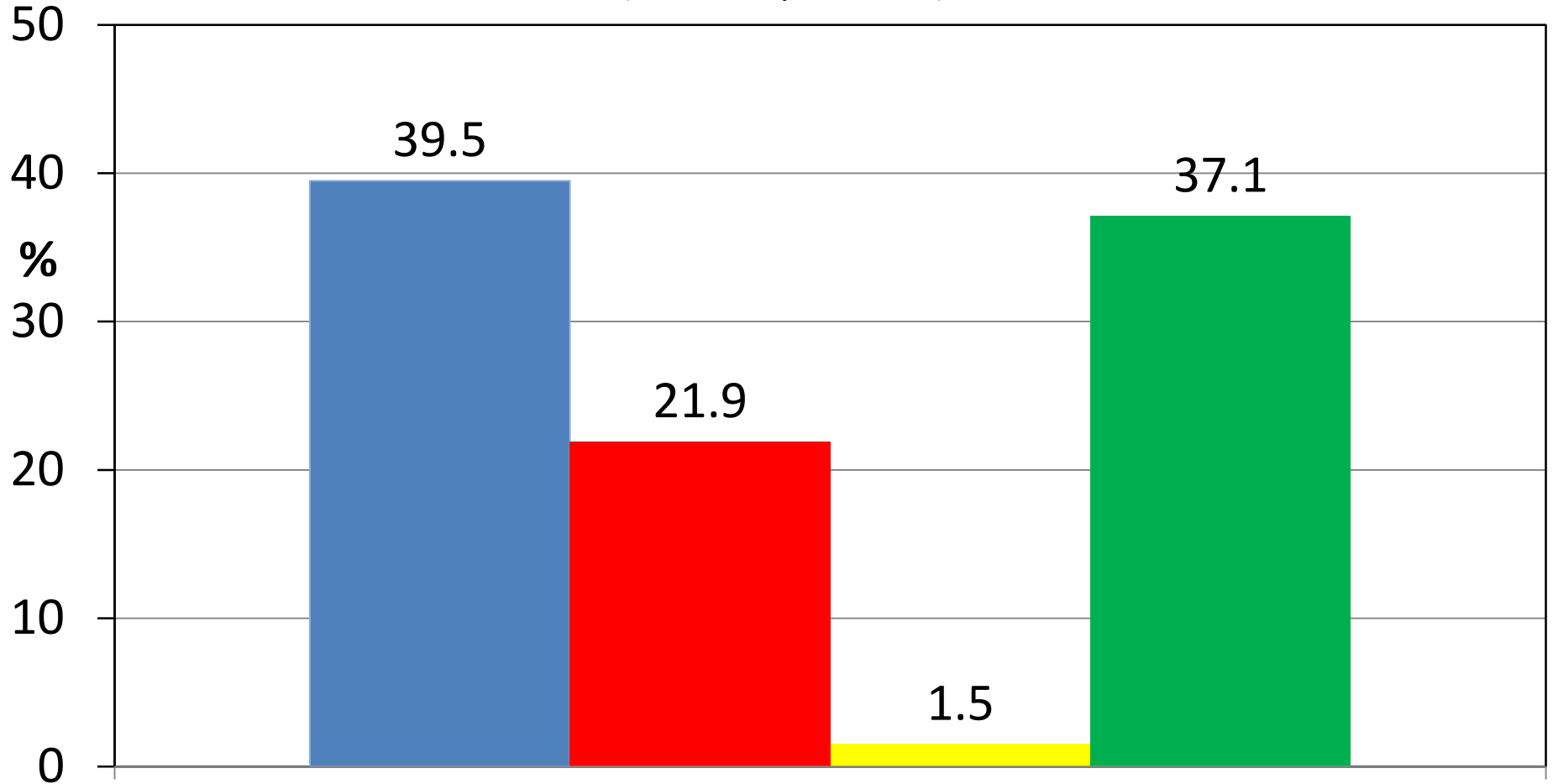

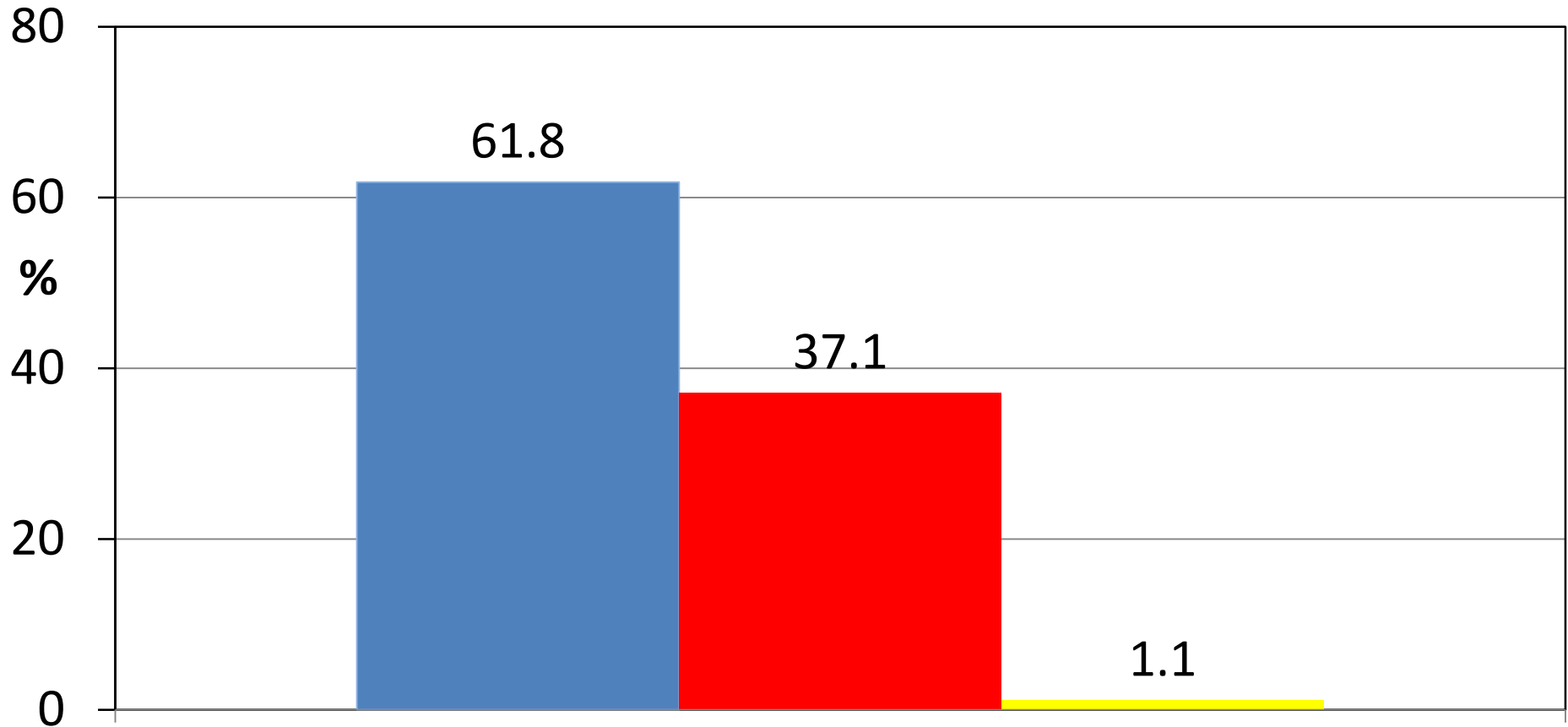

"In the past twelve months, have you or a member of your immediate family required the services of a Health Sciences professional from the public health care system?"

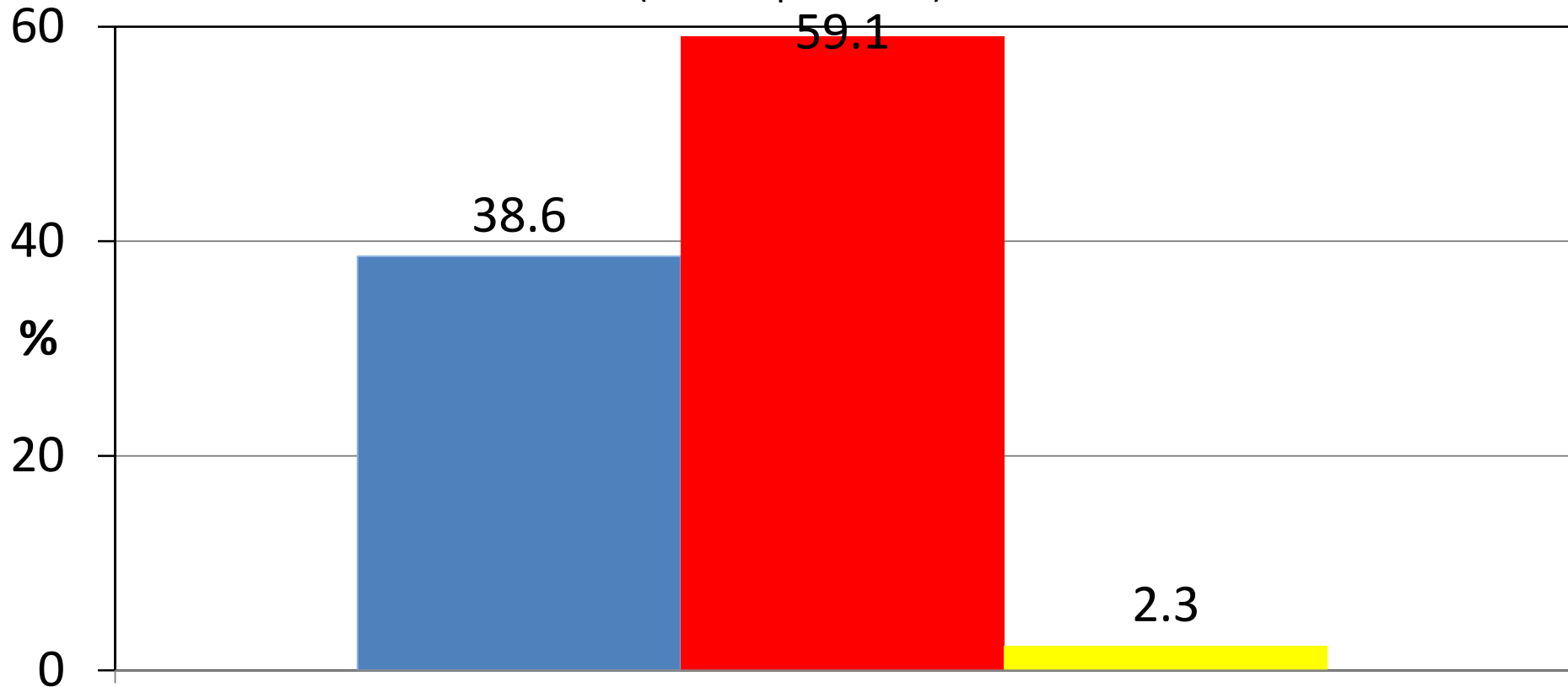

[Asked of those who had accessed services] "When you or your family member required that specialized health care professional, did you have to wait longer than you had expected to access the service or get an appointment?"

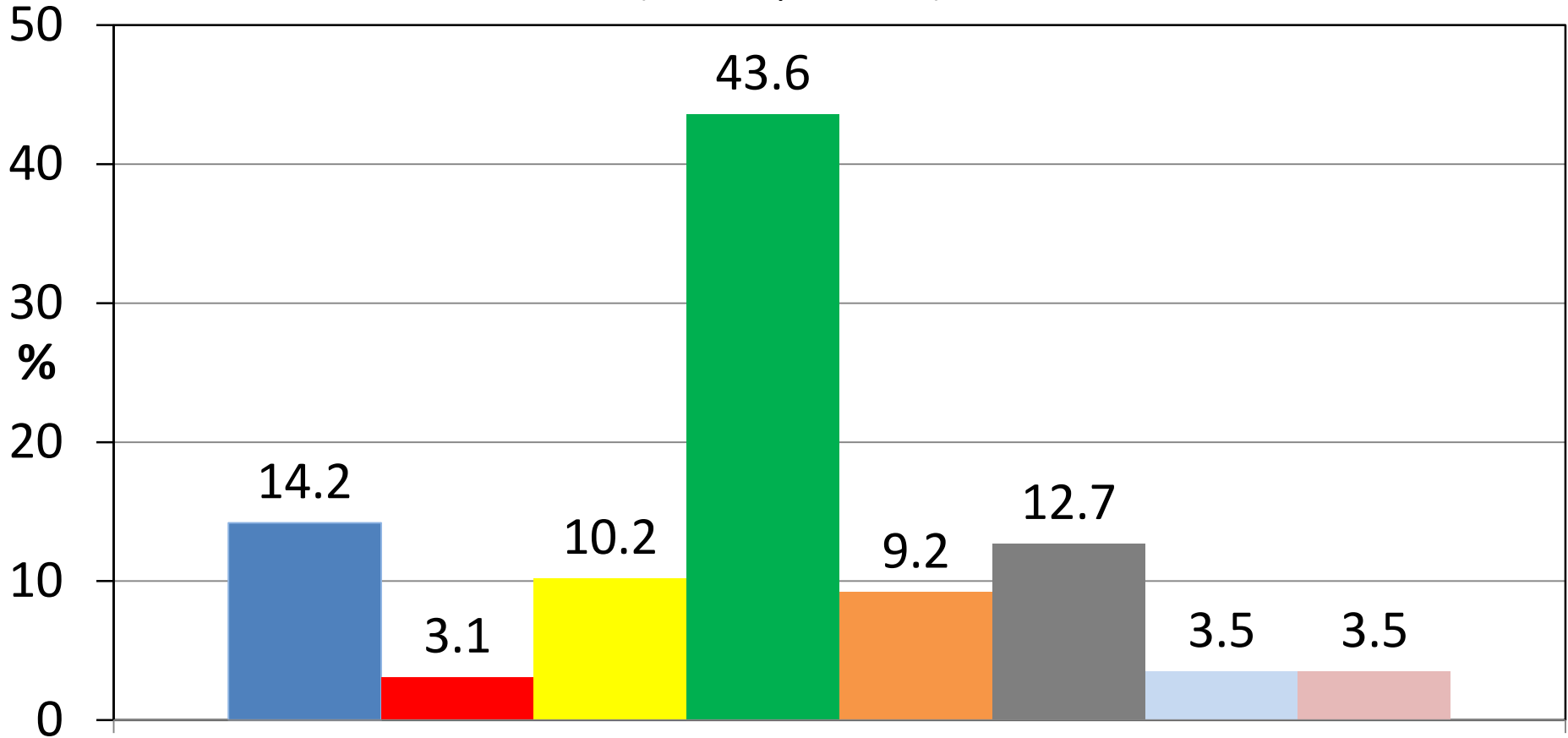

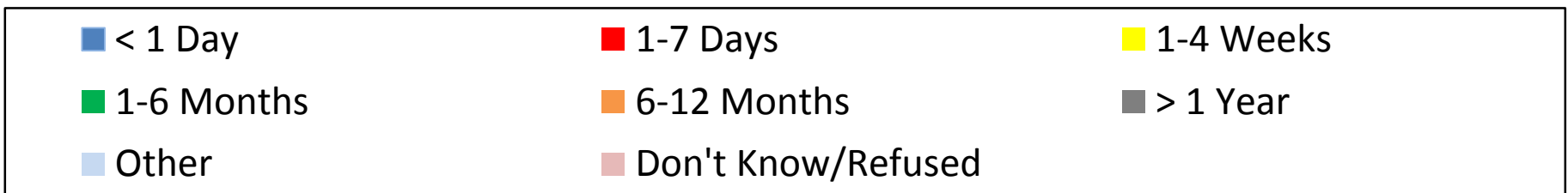

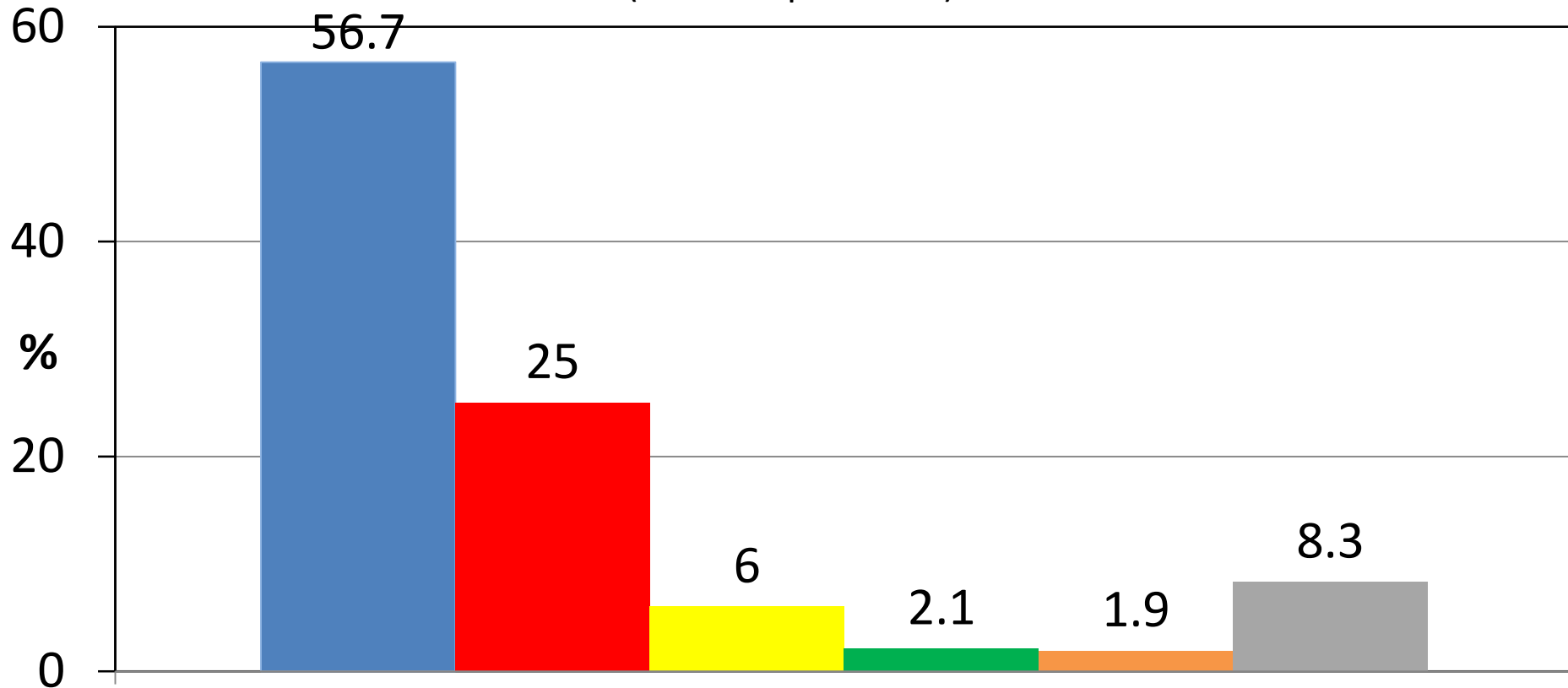


"Approximately how long did you have to wait to access that professional?"

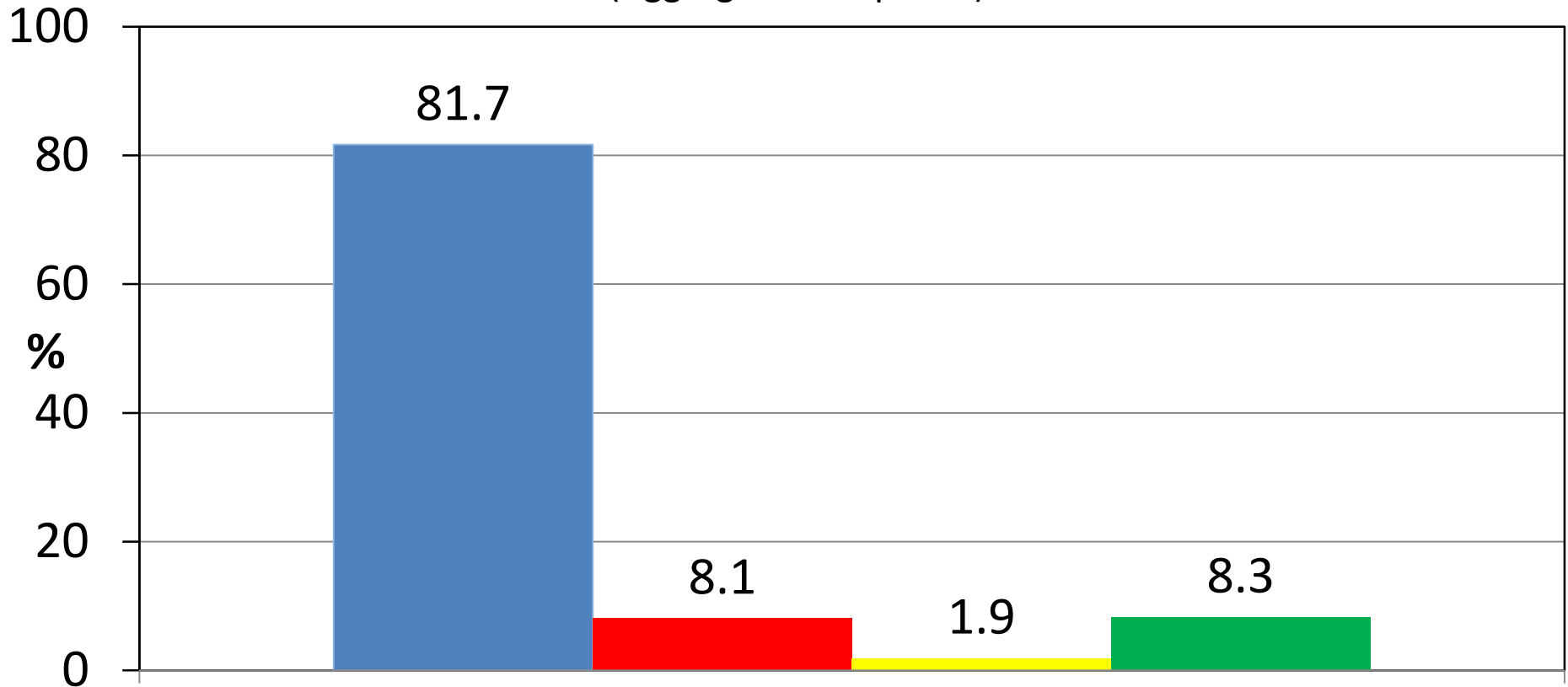

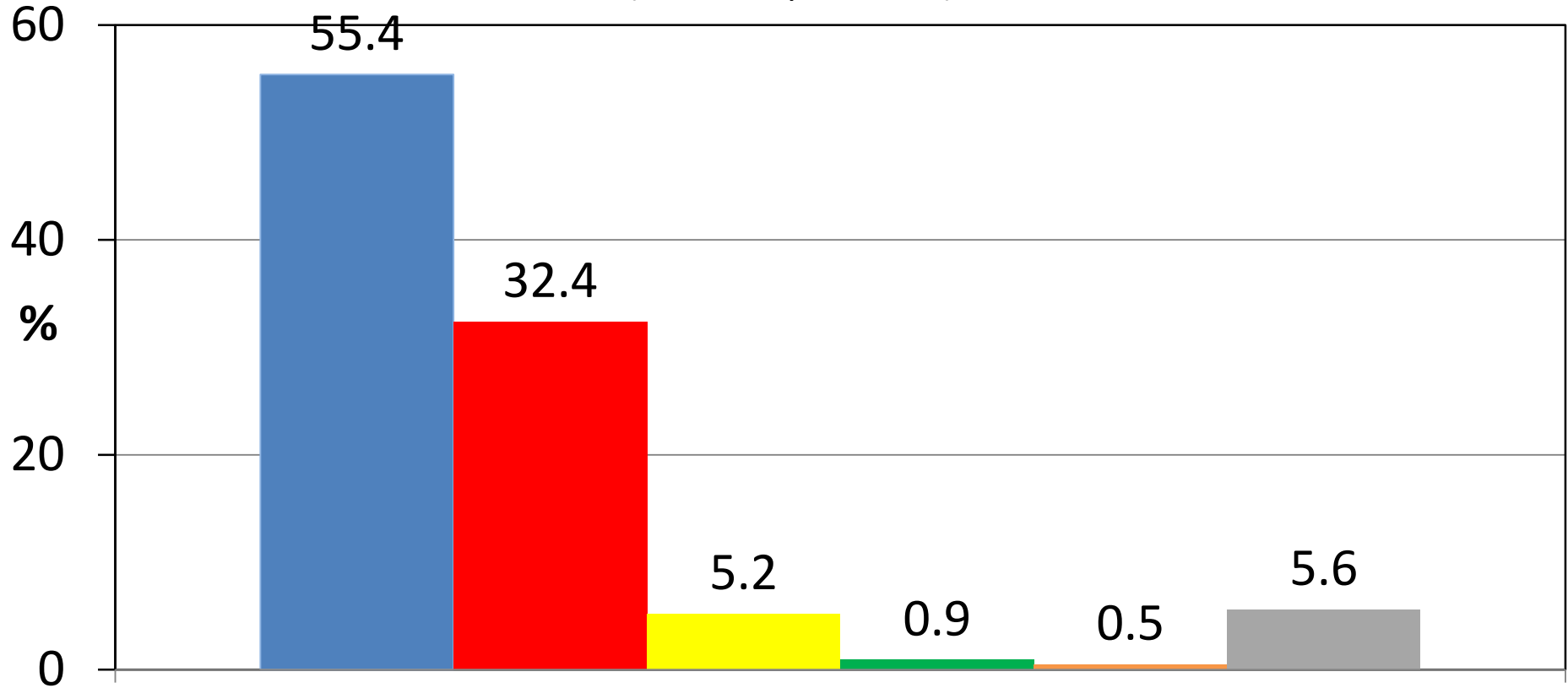

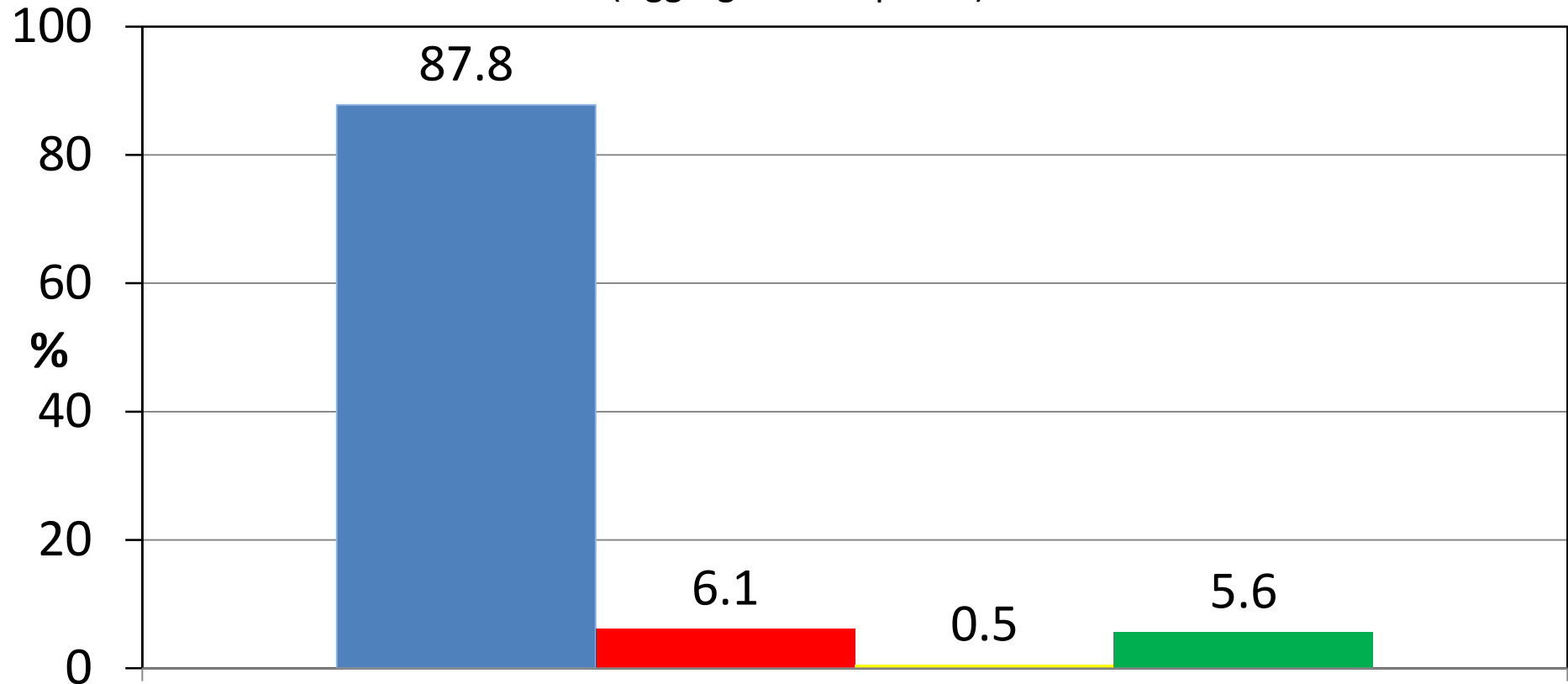

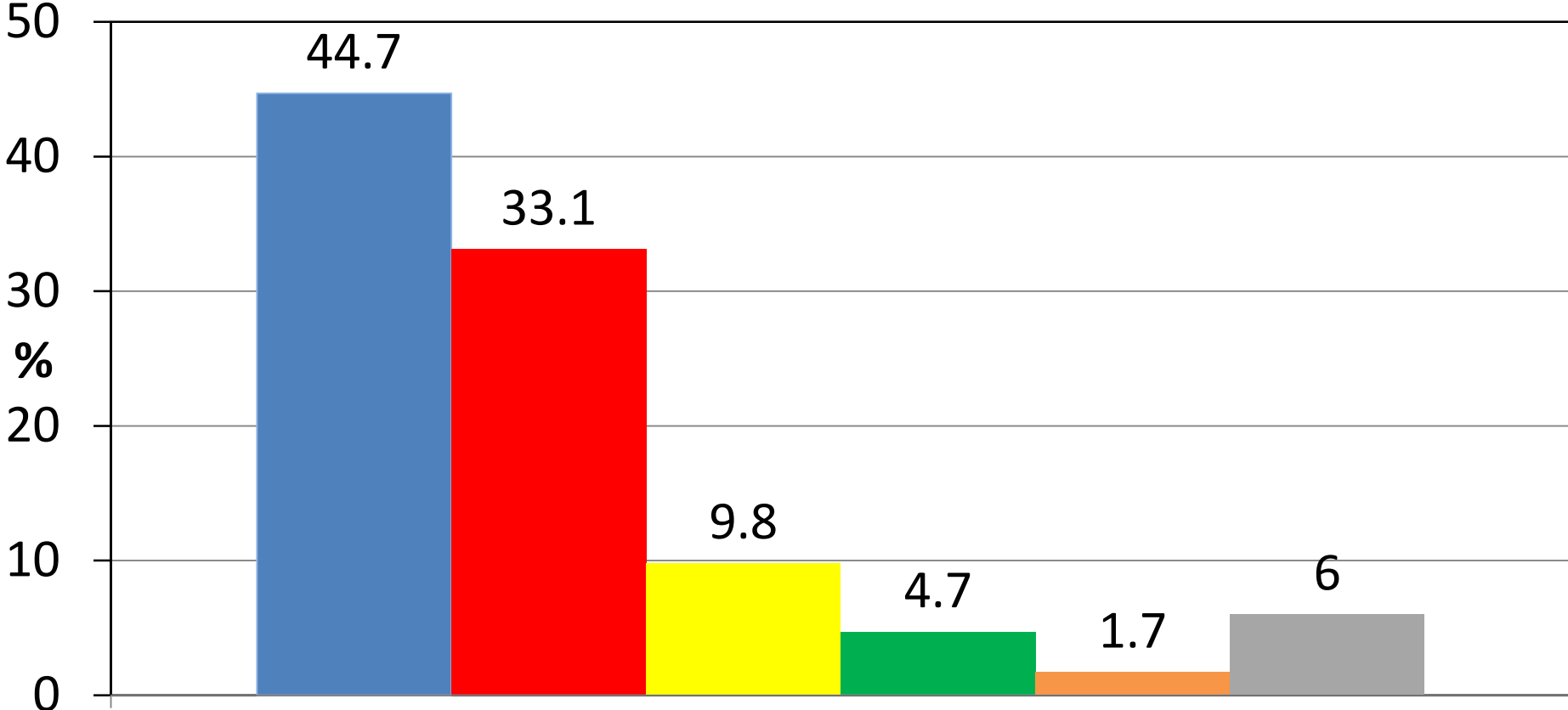

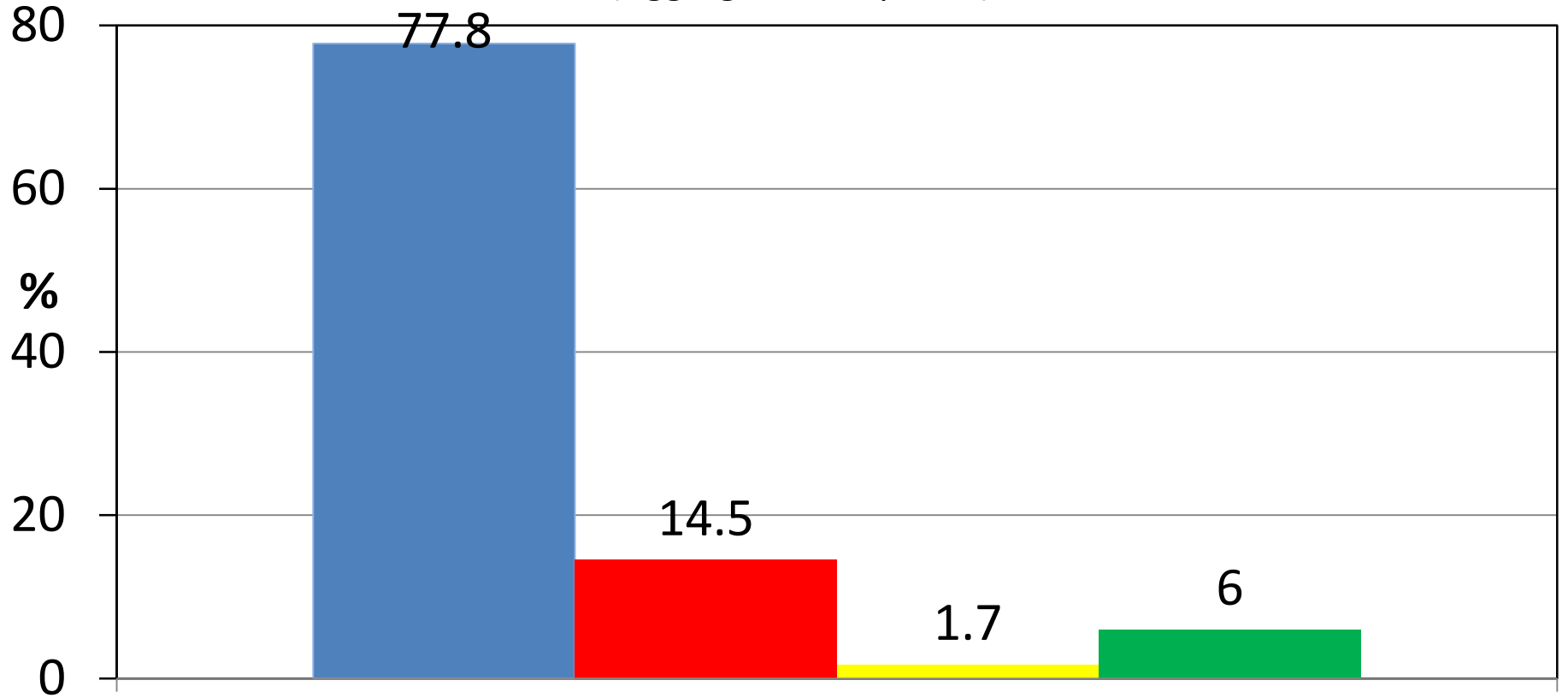
